English: The Transition from KS2 to KS3

Date: Wednesday 12 July 2017

As a Year 7 English Teacher, would you like the opportunity to learn all about the changes to the KS2 SATS and the skills that pupils gain at primary school?

During this two hour session, experienced primary school teachers will outline how pupils are assessed in Year 6. You will have the opportunity to look at writing tasks, past papers and key resources. Practical strategies for improving reading and writing will be discussed and key SPAG terminology explained. By the end of the session you will be clear about the demands of the KS2 curriculum and how we can build upon this foundation at KS3 and beyond.

Emma Kirkham is Assistant Head, Head of English and Literacy at Trinity CE High School. She was designated an Advanced Skills Teacher in 2003 and has recently been awarded Specialist Leader of Education.

Emma is a member of the Teach Manchester English Core Group, which also includes Specialist Leaders of Education focusing on literacy development in the Primary phase. The course will be delivered by this group.

Janet Buck is the Assistant Head with responsibility for Teaching and Learning at Trinity CE High School. She has been Head of the RE Department for 12 years.

Under Janet's leadership the RE Department has attained Gold standard in the Religious Education Quality Mark and the department was judged to be outstanding in National Society Inspection post OFSTED.

All students at Trinity study GCSE RE and the progress data for last year is 81% of students attained A*-C, 34% of students attaining A or A* grades. 57% of students made 4 levels of progress and 25% made 5 levels of progress. Janet works very closely with her colleagues who lead History and Geography and the three departments share teaching and learning development ideas.

- Systems that lead to success.

- Promoting Vocabulary Development;
- Expressive Language Skills;
- Promoting Effective Communication and Social Skills;
- The Link between Speech, Language, Reading and Spelling and Learning It All Together.

It will be delivered by Suzanne Brooks, Assistant Head teacher and SENCO at Trinity CE High School. Suzanne has extensive experience of supporting and developing Teachers and Teaching Assistants to enable them to ensure that all students can fully access the curriculum through quality first teaching. She is a trained Elklan trainer and will be supported by a Speech Therapist. Dates will be published in July.
