We marked Holocaust Memorial Day with special assemblies in school last week. Teacher of Music, Ms Iyoha played the theme tune from the film 'Schindler's List' as students arrived, and the assembly was led by Head of Sixth Form, Ms Tattum, and ended with the following prayer:
