



## **Science Club**

From Ms Handford, teacher of science:

“Science club are preparing to become space biologists and embark on a voyage of discovery by growing seeds that have been into space. Trinity is one of a number of schools to receive a packet of 100 seeds which have been looked after by Tim Peake on the International Space Station for six months. The pupils are growing these seeds alongside seeds that haven’t been to space and will measure the differences over six weeks. The nationwide science experiment will enable the pupils to think more about how we could preserve human life on another planet in the future, what

astronauts need to survive long-term missions in space and the difficulties surrounding growing fresh food in challenging climates.”
