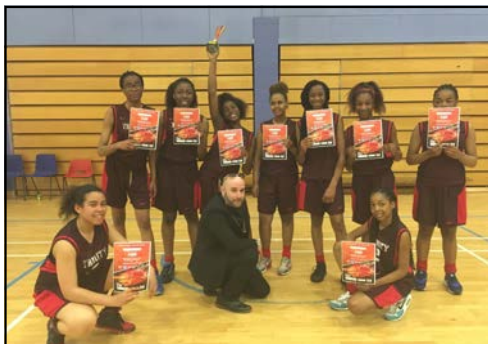

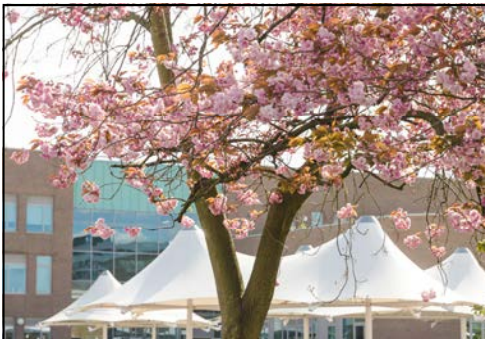
D of E Bronze
