

Photograph Of The Week

Recently, Church of England Schools in the Manchester Diocese received a request to send photographs of any school stained glass windows for inclusion in a Diocesan publication. The above photograph shows the Trinity chapel window, directly adjacent to the visitors' entrance to the school. The window apparently dates from the mid-nineteenth century and was transferred to the school in the 1980s from a church in North Manchester following "de-consecration". When we opened our new school in 2011, we made sure that the window was transferred intact to our new chapel.

Season Of Easter Eucharist

were a credit to the school. Afterwards, Bishop Mark congratulated the students on their performance.”
