Year 7 Winners



From Dr Alnuamaani:

“This year, two educational placement students from the University of Manchester have worked with our ‘A’ level students developing biology lessons that allow them to carry out biological research that is relevant to their science lessons. Last week saw our two placement students delivering

a lesson to our 'A' level biology group looking at mobility in drosophila melanogaster, more commonly known as the humble fruit fly! Our students looked at the mobility of young and old flies, carried out statistical analysis of their results and linked their findings to neurological conditions in humans, such as motor neuron disease. An understanding of these conditions in fruit flies is allowing scientists at The University of Manchester to develop targeted therapies to some of these debilitating conditions in humans."
