
“To provide a Christian environment in which young people are safe, secure, cared for and happy, and are able to develop into articulate, confident and well qualified citizens of the world.”

New School Buildings





Curriculum Awards




We were the first high school in Greater Manchester to achieve the Religious Education Quality Gold Mark and have been awarded Full International School status for our modern languages and overseas dimension work.

Because of our high level of success, the Department of Education provided funds for us to build and open a £3million Trinity Sixth Form and to extend our religious character into the 16-18 age range.
