Our Worshipping Community - Eucharist



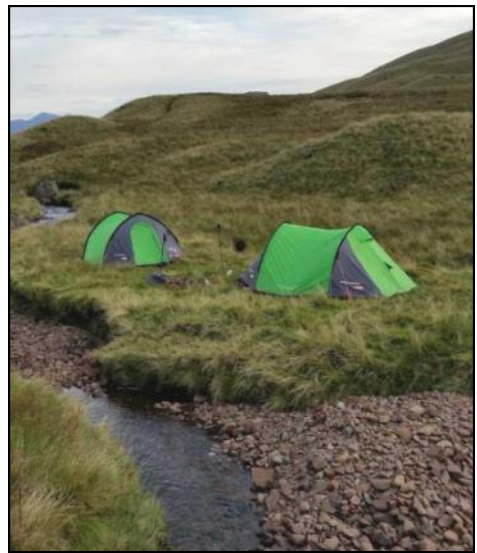
