Ipsos MORI's Annual Survey

Shortly before the Easter holidays, students from 9AGO were invited to take part in the Ipsos MORI Young People Omnibus survey. The Young People Omnibus is a large scale survey of students aged 11-16 in Great Britain. A range of public and voluntary sector organisations use the survey as a way of finding out what young people think about a range of social and personal issues. Information obtained via the survey allows researchers to track key trends, contributing to policies and practices. This was a great opportunity for our students to have their opinions heard on a range of issues that will impact on their lives.

Liverpool Science Park

One of our Year 12 students, Rose Hashemi, attended a 5 day residential trip during the school holidays at Liverpool Science Park. Rose's work included being part of a group in a research lab performing blood typing. In addition to this, Rose spent time in the clinical training centre, learning to perform a head-to-toe respiratory assessment, listening to lung sounds, performing spirometry, taking blood pressure manually, and analysing ECG

readings. The final part of the residential involved participation in an epidemiological investigation. This was an outstanding opportunity for Rose and we are sure that she greatly benefitted from the experience! The below photos show some examples of Rose and others on the residential.
