Entry requirements:

University

You can do a foundation degree or degree in veterinary nursing. The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons has a list of <u>accredited courses</u>.

Entry requirements

You'll usually need:

- · At least 1 A level, or equivalent, for a foundation degree
- 3 A levels, or equivalent, including biology for a degree

College

You can study for a Level 3 Diploma in Veterinary Nursing at college.

You'll spend some time in the classroom and periods of training on placement in a veterinary practice.

The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons has a list of <u>approved training</u> <u>organisations</u> offering the course.

Entry requirements

You'll need:

5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, including English, maths and science

Apprenticeship

You can begin your career by doing a Veterinary Nurse Level 3 Advanced Apprenticeship.

The training takes up to 3 years to complete.

Entry requirements

You'll usually need:

• 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, including English, maths and science

Volunteering

You could get some <u>work experience</u> with a vet, local kennels or animal welfare centre before you start training. You could also try animal charities like the <u>PDSA</u> or <u>RSPCA</u>.
