Re. Year 8 Activity Week Residential to the Peak District

Peak Week is nearly upon us. On the back of this letter is a letter regarding the beach and The Snow Centre trips too with a timetable for the full week.

Please can I draw your attention to some important areas for the Peak District;

- All students need to bring sun screen, a hat and a water bottle, waterproof coat regardless of how grey it might be on Monday/Wednesday morning, when the sun shines they'll need these.
- It is expected that students who use inhalers for asthma and take anti-hayfever medications will keep these on themselves and will know how and when to use them. But can I suggest that you ensure they also bring a spare.
- All other medications should be given to your child's Form Tutor on Monday/Wednesday morning.
- No more than £15 spends should be brought – the only real opportunity to shop is for sweets & drinks to be bought onsite.
- Alcoholic drinks and 'energy' drinks together with cigarettes/vapes should not be brought. If found they will be disposed of and appropriate action taken.
- **No** electronic items (iPads/mobile phones etc.) should be brought. **Staff WILL NOT take responsibility for such items.**
- There are a number of people attending the trip who suffer from nut allergies. Please do not send any nuts with your child.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

As we are fast approaching the Year 8 Activities Week, I am writing to give you more information about the events that your child will participate in for the two days when not attending the Peak District. There are no additional costs as these trips are already covered by the contributions made for the overall Peak Experience.

On either the Mon/Tues (6th&7th July) or Thurs/Fri (9th&10th July) your child should arrive at Trinity by **8.25am**. (at the latest) and meet their form tutor in classrooms located on the **Maths Corridor**. After registration, they will then get a coach to either The Snow Centre or Ainsdale Beach.

The Snow Centre

Pupils will have a Ski Introductory Lesson (1hr) and time at the Snow Park (1hr) before returning to Trinity where they will have their lunch. Meals will be provided in the canteen as 'normal'. Students do not need to bring a packed lunch but may wish to bring a snack and drink. In the afternoon, pupils will play a range of board games. The school day will end at 3.05 p.m.

The Snow Centre will provide students with boots, skis and a helmet for the ski lesson. However, students should wear warm clothes, a waterproof coat and warm gloves. Students **WILL NOT** be allowed to participate should they not have their own **gloves**. They will also need sturdy shoes/trainers for the Snow Park Play.

Beach Day

At Ainsdale Beach, students will participate in a range of activities, including: sandcastle building, beach football, beach cricket, beach rounders and beach volleyball. As the weather is unpredictable, students should be prepared for all conditions. We suggest that they bring sun cream, a sun hat, a towel, a change of clothes if they want to paddle and a waterproof coat. Students will also need to bring water and a packed lunch (the school will provide a packed lunch for any students who receive free school meals). Whilst students may bring a small amount of money (we suggest no more than £5) to purchase an ice-cream should a van be there, there are no other shops in the vicinity. Depending upon traffic, we aim to be back at school by approximately 3.05 p.m.
