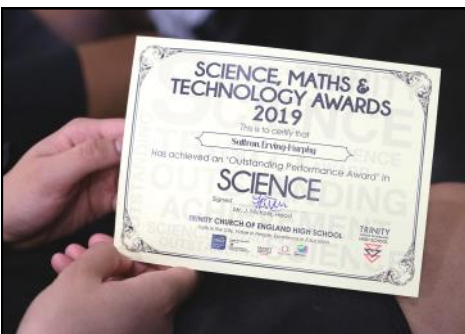
## Chess Champions

## And finally...

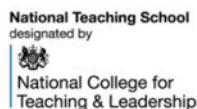
