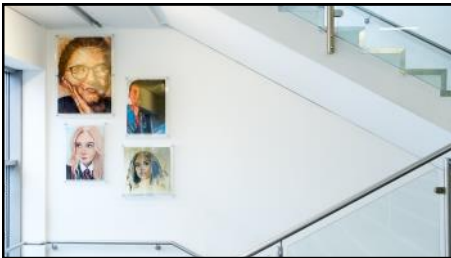
Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award

Outstanding Art

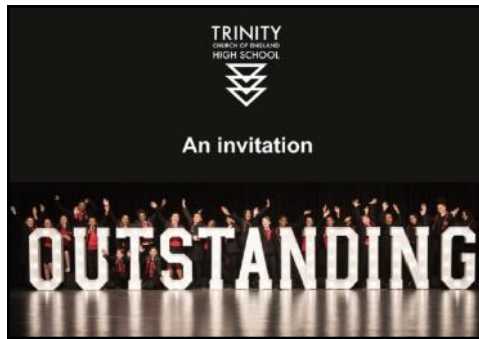
Over the summer, we have had new picture frames installed around the school to showcase the fabulous artwork completed by Trinity students.

Every Tues, Weds, Thurs from 17th September to 24th October, 2019

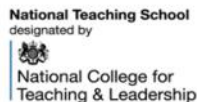
