Staying Safe in School

Messages outlining new procedures in school have been given to our students this week and we would also like to remind parents of the following:

- Apart from a pencil case, students will also **need a bottle of hand sanitiser** to carry with them. These will also be available for purchase in school. Students entitled to free school meals will receive one free bottle.
- The school has issued all students with a 'mini whiteboard' pack (free of charge). Students will need to carry this in a **school bag** which will fit an A4 wallet folder in as well as PE kit, books etc.
- **Full school uniform** is expected - please visit the uniform section on the school website for further details.
- Students need to have a **plain face covering** to wear when moving around the school.




And finally...
