

The summer exam season will begin on 7th June, 2021 and end on 2nd July, 2021, for almost all GCSEs, AS and A levels. The dates for the results days are as follows:

- Tuesday, 24th August, 2021 AS and A level results day.
- Friday, 27th August, 2021 GCSE results day.
